

JP public register – find a JP

You can find a Justice of the Peace (**JP**) using the online JP public register. You can search by postcode, name of a JP, language spoken and JP registration number.


The register lists a JP’s location, availability and telephone number. Please note that JPs are volunteers and may not be available at all times.

Follow the steps below to use the JP public register.







Step 1: read and accept the terms of use

Go to [JP Online](#) and select **Find a JP** from the homepage. Then select **Access the JP public register**.

This online register is provided under the [Justices of the Peace Act 2002 \(NSW\)](#). It includes only current JPs in New South Wales.

Tips for contact with JPs on the register

Ensure that a NSW JP is authorised to witness your documents. The JP handbook provides guidance on what services a JP can provide. [Read JP handbook](#).

- Contact JPs at a reasonable time (between 8am and 6pm).
- Ask the JP when and where they are available to provide JP services.
- Advise the JP in advance if you have a large amount of documents for witnessing or certifying (you may have to make an appointment).
- Have all your paperwork ready for the JP, ensuring that your documents are not pre-signed.
- Have identification documents ready for the JP if necessary.
- Be mindful that JPs do not provide legal advice.

If you wish to proceed to access the JP public register you will need to first confirm that you have read the terms of use and that you agree to abide by them. Access the terms of use via the link below.

Step 2: enter search details

Type details into the fields you would like to search. You can search a single field or multiple fields. Search multiple fields to narrow your results.

Select **Search** to continue.

Tips for using the public register

- Select the fields you would like to search.
- You can select a single field or multiple fields.
- When searching multiple fields, if you select **Language** and **Postcode** for example, your search will return JPs who are available in that postcode and speak the language you selected. If you select only **Postcode**, it will return JPs who are available in that postcode.
- When searching the **Day available** field you can only search one day at a time, if you require a JP on two days (e.g Monday or Wednesday) you will have to do separate searches for Monday and Wednesday.
- Searching multiple fields at the same time will return more tailored results. There are no limits on how many fields you can select.

Step 3: view the search results

The search results will display. Select a JP to view their service details.

You can use the scroll bar to move the list up and down.

When you are finished, close the tab to return to the JP website.

- Select the fields you would like to search.
